


What's been happening at nursery?

This half term, we have been learning and exploring about many festivals and celebrations held across the world. The children have explored the Hindu Festival of Diwali and made links with how fireworks and lights are used to celebrate Bonfire Night also. We also have been inviting children and families to celebrate the cultural diversity of our nursery, celebrating languages and family heritage using our classroom world map. In addition to this, children have been blasting off to space in roleplay spaceships linked to our core book 'Whatever Next!' and exploring with a variety of sensory experiences!

Parent and key worker conferences

Throughout October and November, key workers completed their Parent Conferences to discuss how well the children have settled and learn about new interests and activities they are involved in at home. Learning priorities have been identified and the 'next steps' in children's learning agreed together. Next steps are a good way to show specific progress that the children make within a specific area of their learning. Although we know it is impossible to set next steps in all aspects of children's learning, we can track a 'learning journey' for some aspects that seem most relevant and important.

Records of Achievement

All children have a 'Record of Achievement' and nursery staff continue to share them with children and add new learning stories to capture children's achievements and successes. We encourage children to reflect and think about their learning and how it is successful for them. Through regular questioning and Record of Achievement reviews, we strengthen children's understanding of how they learn best and support them in their confidence and enthusiasm as independent learners. If you have not returned your child's Record of Achievement to nursery, please do so by the end of term. This will enable key workers to add more learning and successes for you to share over the Christmas break.



Records of Achievements will be sent home with children at the end of term to enable families to share and celebrate learning at home. We will look forward to seeing new 'Wow moments' and reflection comments added when they return.

Christmas Celebrations

Throughout December, the children will be learning and engaging in activities about the Christian festival of Christmas. Children have been busy creating Christmas tree decorations and cards for their families and enjoying a range of festive songs and stories with the nursery team. It was lovely to see so many families come to join us on our Stay and Play session on Thursday 8th December to decorate the nursery and trees. Children were highly engaged and took great pride in sharing their decorations with their friends and nursery staff.

Attendance

Just a reminder that if your child is away from school for any reason please let Louise, Julie or Zaima in the office know. You can phone (020 8660 5639) or email (office@purley.croydon.sch.uk).

As a Local Authority School, we are expected to monitor attendance and note on registers the reasons for absence. This attendance/absence data is requested by the Local Authority, the Department for Education and Ofsted. We have a duty to contact you if you have not informed us already that your child is absent - for any reason. Please, therefore, do contact us as indicated above as it is very time consuming to 'phone families if you have not contacted us.

Drop off and collection times

Thank you to all families for being so prompt and supportive of our collection/ drop off times. Drop and collection is managed through our space indicators in the main entrance and through the support of our children and families. This is to ensure child safety and support transition times for our young and vulnerable pupils. During these winter months, we appreciate that getting ready to leave nursery may take a little time, especially if children have hats, gloves, scarves etc. We kindly ask that parents remain patient and understanding in this. You can support your child and us to aid collection times by helping and encouraging your child to be independent with dressing and collecting these winter items at the end of session as swiftly as possible. In addition, if you wish to speak to a member of the nursery team, please make an appointment or use the messaging option on Seesaw. It is not possible for staff to speak to all parents at the end of the day however we do encourage parent partnerships as much as possible. If you are unsure or have any concerns about your child, please speak to Polly or Maria.

Purley Nursery School Breakfast Club

To support working families in the morning with drop off routines, Purley Nursery School can offer Breakfast Club care for children from 7.45am Monday to Friday. All children attending Breakfast Club are welcomed by Julie in The Nest and are offered a healthy breakfast and play to enable them to have a happy, calm start to their day.

- 7.45am to the start of their nursery session £4.25 per day
- **8.00am** to the start of their nursery session £3.00 per day

Developing positive attitudes towards reading is crucial at this age and we wish to foster and nurture it through lots of positive, rich experiences in our book area. If you or any member of your family wish to come into Nursery to assist the nursery team or Katie in the home school library please let us know.

We encourage all children to join our Home-School Library so if you haven't signed up please speak to Julie, Louise or Zaima in the office so we can issue you with a plastic wallet (£1) or order you a Purley Nursery Book bag (£4.50).

Seesaw

Seesaw has been a great success this term and it is great to see children engaging in home learning activities and sharing these experiences with nursery staff and their friends. If you have not downloaded Seesaw to access your child's journal and the activities set by Maria and the team please speak to a member of the nursery team or contact the school office. Here is this weeks' activity to support your child's awareness of the natural changes of the season and their independence skills in dressing.



End of Term Parties - Thursday 15th December

To mark the end of the Autumn Term, children and nursery staff will be hosting end of term parties as part of their morning or afternoon session on **Thursday 15**th **December**. Children who stay all day join in both parties. Celebrations will include: dancing, singing and enjoying a festive sit down snack with friends at nursery.

Voluntary contributions towards our 'End of Term Parties' would be most welcome and there will be a collecting box in the School Office.

All food and drink will be provided by the school for the children on the day. If you have any questions regarding the festive party snacks please speak to Polly or Maria.

Nursery Clothes

Please check at home to see whether you might have any clothes belonging to the school. We'd be pleased if you could return them to us as soon as possible.

Coats, jumpers and winter accessories

As the winter weather draws in, please ensure that your child brings in a warm coat and outdoor accessories e.g. gloves to nursery. The children have been working really hard to master zipping up their coats this half term! As a next challenge, why not practice with your child to put their hat and gloves on by themselves at home to support their independence and management of these belongings. The children have been working really hard to master zipping up their coats this half term!

Please ensure that you write your child's name or initials on all coats, uniform, hats, scarves and gloves. To aid children identifying this, please show them their name or initials so that they can find their items more easily at nursery. Letter recognition and awareness is a fantastic early



literacy skill which we support and encourage at nursery. Once your child recognises their initials in their clothes items, it can be a great spring-board for early reading and writing skills. Why not use the winter break to carry out this exciting activity at home ready to explore and develop further at nursery in Spring. In addition to this, we wish to support children in managing their own belongings at nursery therefore these visual cues are a helpful tip in this.

Snack and Cooking - VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION

To enable the children to have a daily healthy fruit snack during the session and for the children to experience cooking activities each week, we are asking parents to make a voluntary contribution of £1 per week or £13 per term to help towards the cost. We rely on these donations to do this. If we do not receive enough contributions to do this we may need to reduce snack and cooking opportunities in the nursery. Parent Workshops and Coffee mornings

This term we carried out parent workshops to support families and children at nursery, understand the Early Years Curriculum and explore Parental Involvement for Learning. The 'EYFS Curriculum - Learning and Development' outlined the curriculum that children learn

throughout the Early Years and finally 'Parental Involvement' which explained lots of different ways parents can support children's development at home.

We plan to repeat these workshops in the Spring to support parents and families who were unable to attend this term. Dates to be confirmed next term.

In addition to this, coffee mornings were held for parents and carers to come together to share experiences and ask questions regarding Seesaw, Forest School, SEND (Special Educational Needs) and how to support your child in toileting. Next term, Purley Nursery School plans to offer more opportunities for parents to join us to discuss support in: Seesaw, managing independence and self-help skills, how to support skills in Literacy and activities to develop communication and language. We strongly advise that parent controls are set up on their devices before the children are allowed to use them. **Safer Internet** have lots of information for parents about setting up parental controls. They also recommend having open and honest conversations with children about their online use.

Age restrictions of Social Media Apps

Please be mindful that social media apps are not appropriate for pupils under the age of 13. Below are the age restrictions for the most popular apps:

- What's App—16 years
- Instagram—13 years
- Facebook—13 years
- Snapchat—13 years
- TikTok—13 Years







What are the risk of children using social media apps?

- Many sites include an instant message function that allows private conversations between site members.
- Most social networking sites have an app version available, meaning your child will have access to the social network from their smartphone or tablet.
- Some app versions of social networks use the location of the phone.

- Information shared between friends can be easily copied and may spread.
- It isn't easy to take back information that has been posted and can be impossible if it's already been shared.
- Not everyone your child meets online will be who they say they are. Chatrooms and forums can connect people who are complete strangers and can be unmoderated.
- Chatrooms and forums are some of the places online groomers go to connect with children. They can also be places where people use a lot of sexual language and engage in online flirting. This is sometimes done through video chat programs.
